Title: “Dusty Offspring” by Joshua Campbell

Text: Genesis 13: 1-18

God lifts our eyes to see the royal seed and soil.

I. Lot Lifts His Eyes v. 8-13

II. Abram’s Eyes Are Lifted v. 14-18

Application – *“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves”* (James 1:22).

Our responsibility, by God’s grace and power, is to consistently apply the truths of God’s Word that we have heard to our lives (Phil. 2:1-13; 1 Tim. 4:7-9; James 1:22-27). As you meditate on the sermon and this passage of Scripture, ask yourself these questions:
